The OtoArt Exhibition & Charity Auction is a fundraising initiative of the Walter Spohn Trust (WST). Since 2011, OtoArt shows have celebrated artistic inspiration drawn from the complex form of the human ear, where imaginative artists transform twelve-inch polyurethane ear forms into Visual Expressions of Hearing. OtoArt Ear Sculptures are featured each year at the International Anaplastology Association conference. This year, the 2019 OtoArt Exhibition & Charity Auction expands the celebration to include the entire human body-Head to Toe.

The Walter Spohn Trust is seeking donated submissions of artwork for the 2019 OtoArt Exhibition & Charity Auction. Donated artwork will be auctioned to raise funds for the Walter Spohn Trust. The Walter Spohn Trust is a 501(c)3 non-profit organization which provides financial support to individuals and groups engaged in educational or research projects to advance the field of Anaplastology. Anaplastology is a medical specialty focused on the design and fabrication of custom prostheses to restore anatomy disfigured or malformed as a result of trauma, disease, congenital origin. Funds raised through the charity art auction will be designated for WST Giving Programs.

The WST requests that donated artwork communicates the theme: HEAD TO TOE. How artists wish to creatively express the theme is completely their choice.

OtoArt is a celebration of artistic inspiration drawn from the beauty of human anatomy.

All artists, age 18 years or older, are eligible to participate. A maximum of 30 donated submissions will be accepted. *All 30 donated artworks will be included in the charity auction fundraiser, hosted online and open to the public for viewing and bidding. *See Rule #8 below. A maximum of 12 donated submissions will be selected for exhibition at the 2019 International Anaplastology Association Annual Conference in Scottsdale, Arizona, June 12-15, 2019. One of the 12 contributing artists whose donated artwork is included in the exhibition will be eligible to receive an award of \$1000 USD, in recognition of their exceptional work. Registered conference participants will form the collective juror to determine the recipient of this award.

Participation Rules - Criteria for submission of design is as follows. Any criteria not met will disqualify entry, preventing the artwork from being selected for exhibition and/or included in the charity auction.

- Prior to submitting artwork, the artist must complete the OtoArt 2019 Artist Enrollment Form online at: http://walterspohntrust.org/2019-otoart-enrollment-form Upon receipt of the enrollment form, the WST will reply to the artist and issue the artist a Participant Number. The Participant Number MUST BE INCLUDED on the Artist Participation Agreement submitted with the donated artwork.
- Designs must communicate the following theme: Head to Toe
- Designs must be two-dimensional, generated using customary printmaking techniques (woodcut, engraving, etching, linocut, collagraph, lithography, mezzotint, aquatint, drypoint, screenprinting, monotype, monoprint, mixed-media prints, foil imaging, etc.) or digital prints (digitally designed and printed graphic prints). Digital prints must be high-resolution (300dpi). Drawings and paintings are also permitted; however, they must be on high-quality paper, not canvas. The WST has set this criteria for management of submissions and exhbition display requirements.
- All submissions shall be original works of art that have never been copied or published before for any purpose. Artists must hold all ownership interest in the design submitted including all intellectual property rights. Designs submitted may not be based on or taken from other works of any party nor may any part of the submission be in the "public domain." No other works may have been produced which are based in whole or in part on the submission. All submissions must be free from any claims of libel, defamation or invasion of privacy. All submissions must be free from any claims, liens, or encumbrances.
- The submission must be 11x17 inches, vertical orientation. Submitted artwork should be delivered flat (not tubed); plastic sleeves and/or ample stiff mat board or cardboard to support and protect your submission are strongly recommended. Electronic forms of submission including flash drives will not be accepted as the sole entry. The physical artwork must be given at the time of submission.
- Artists must sign the Artist Participation Agreement exempting the Walter Spohn Trust from any liability for loss or damage to submissions.
- Each artist may submit only one entry. Collaborative efforts will be accepted; however, each artist must sign the Artist Participation Agreement.
- By participating, the artist agrees to donate the artwork to the Walter Spohn Trust and relinquish any rights to monetary compensation to the WST. This includes money made from the sale/auction of the ear sculpture, sale of the exhibit catalog, or sale of future promotional items. The artist also grants the WST full and unrestricted license for up to five years to use images of the artwork to promote the exhibit, charity auction, and/or include on merchandise sold by the WST for fundraising purposes. The artist retains full copyright for the use of their artwork.
- The Walter Spohn Trust has the right to reject donated artwork from inclusion in the charity auction and exhibition if the WST determines that it does not follow the Participation Rules, or if the WST determines it is offensive or inappropriate in any way. In such case, excluded artwork will be returned to the artist.

Through grants and scholarships, the WST provides financial support for research and education in the field of Anaplastology, a clinical specialty that provides prosthetic restoration of facial or somatic (body) anatomy for patients impacted by malformation or disfigurement from disease, trauma, or congenital origin. Prosthetic solutions can serve as an alternative treatment option if surgical reconstruction is unachievable or not desired by the patient.


